The first convention of the People's Struggle Movement will be held on March 27 at 3.00 pm at the Ananda Samarakoon Outdoor Theater in Nugegoda, under the theme 'True Hope - A People's Movement'.

The government's internal political crisis has begun to erupt in the face of an overall economic crisis, including a shortage of dollars, a shortage of essential goods and services and rising commodity prices. Paddy Fields Militarized!

There will soon be armed military personnel in paddy fields, not to help farmers, but to suppress their protests against the government regarding fertilizer shortages. Recently the government hinted military personnel will be deployed to stop organized farmers' protests.

President Gotabhaya Rajapaksha, who was also Defence Secretary, unofficially militarized the government by appointing a number of military personnel into key positions. Also, each district of the country was also appointed by military officers with administration powers over the government district secretaries.

Farmers from Frontline Socialist Party (FLSP) are criticizing the government's move to militarize agriculture, stating that this is another development to chase away farmers from the land and please multinational farming companies.



'Free Women!' the women's wing of the FLSP organized a protest campaign and a seminar to mark the International Women's Day on March 8. The event underthe theme 'Women's Power - People's Movement' emphasized the need to organize a people's force aimed at resolving the problems of the oppressed, including women.

A professional Centre for People
